



June 26, 1950 Bishop Wendelin J. Nold signed a Decree of Erection establishing St. Francis of Assisi Parish at 5102 Dabney St., Houston, Texas 77026.

St. Francis of Assisi Church was founded in September 1950. The original congregation was 700 families of 60 percent Czech descent and 40 percent from other European backgrounds. As these families moved out of the neighborhood and Black families migrated in, the demographics of the parish slowly changed. Today, African Americans are the predominant group with Hispanics, Asians, and Caucasians as minori-
